CENTERS:

- Follow Lessons in order Unit 1: Skills for Learning Lessons 1-6 Unit 2: Empathy – Lessons 7-12 Unit 3: Emotion Management – Lessons 12-18 Unit 4: Friendship Skills and Problem Solving – Lessons 19-25 Unit 5: Transitioning to Kindergarten – Lessons 26-28
- 2) Complete 1 lesson per week during one of your group times (small or large). Write the <u>number</u> <u>and name</u> of the lesson on your lesson plan i.e. "SS#5 Feelings Change"
- 3) Follow each card by completing the activities set for each day of the week with Friday's being incorporated into another day.
- 4) Use Weekly Staff Meetings on Fridays to go over the "Weekly Plan" and the "Week-at-a-Glance Sheet", so all staff know what their role will be in incorporating the next week's lessons. Post completed "Weekly Plan" and the "Week-At-A-Glance Sheet" with lesson plan.
- 5) You can choose whether or not you want to use the Take Home Letters, starting on pg 55 of your Teacher's Guide to send to parents before you complete the lessons (also available on your on-line Second Step account under "Families"). Some of the information will be made available through the NESD Head Start Newsletter.
- 6) Make copies of page 47 "Program Introductory Letter" from your teacher guide with your site's on-line access code for parents and add to your site's parent packets that you go over on initial home visits.

HOME BASE:

- 1) Follow Lessons in order Unit 1: Skills for Learning Lessons 1-6
 - Unit 2: Empathy Lessons 7-12
 - **Unit 3: Emotion Management** Lessons 12-18
 - Unit 4: Friendship Skills and Problem Solving Lessons 19-25
 - Unit 5: Transitioning to Kindergarten Lessons 26-28
- 2) Complete 1 lesson per week during each home visit and/or group. Write the number and name of the lesson on your lesson plan i.e. "SS#5 Feelings Change"
- 3) Follow each card's first lesson using the card and choose one other activity to incorporate into the home visit and/or group (alternating types of activities i.e. puppets, stories, songs, etc. throughout the year).
